Synod on Synodality

The Synod is a two-year, worldwide process of praying and listening in order to discern how best to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ at this time in history. Pope Francis initiated the Synod to help spur ongoing renewal of the Church throughout the world. It will culminate with a formal gathering of the world's Catholic bishops in Vatican City in 2023. The focus will be on promoting communion, participation and mission among all members of the Church.

Here are report from various US Synods:

Diocese of Oakland: "Ordained ministry should be open to women, fully & affirmatively."

Archdiocese of Cincinnati: "There are many who consider the ordination of women to be a matter of social justice."

Diocese of Columbus: "A number of respondents identify the treatment of women in the church has a major obstacle, from feeling dismissed to citing the lack of women's roles in the church (preaching, women deacons & women priests). This is seen as a missed opportunity or a discriminatory lack of respect."
