



In today's gospel reading we hear of the rulers, soldiers and one of the criminals sneering at and belittling Jesus. One person, the second criminal, humbly approaches the Lord and recognizes and acknowledges Jesus as the Christ. As I reflect on this this, I wonder how it is that people make judgments about others. How can it be that people can hear the same message yet come to such differing conclusions? Or, were the crowds and soldiers truly listening? I think not. I would suggest that for whatever reason, they had not been willing to open their hearts, minds and spirits to faithfully hear the story and message that Jesus had proclaimed – a life giving message promised to the "good thief." Let us ask ourselves, do we truly listen to the story of others or are we quick to make judgments. Do we look to see the divine in others, that they are beloved of God? Or do we close our eyes to this reality? May we strive to become more like the "good thief" in our encounters with our God and one another, to truly hear and see. It will be life giving to us.


